Today we welcome the Project Transformation Fellow at Matthews Memorial United Methodist Church, Angela Thomas. She leads the elementary afterschool

program serving thirty children and their families. This summer, Project Transformation will serve approximately eighty 1st-8th grade children at Matthews Memorial. It is one of seven sites in the Middle Tennessee area.

In summer 2017, 99% of the children attending the Matthews Memorial program improved or maintained their reading level over the summer with the help of 254 volunteers reading one-on-one with the children. Twelve of us from City Road Chapel read with the children and there will be another opportunity to serve this summer. The Matthews Memorial children have continued to improve their reading, math, and emotional-learning skills during the 2017-2018 school year.

City Road Chapel is one of ninety partner churches in Tennessee. We pray for the staff and Fellows who lead the programs and the summer college students who serve the children. Throughout the year, City Road provides volunteers; individuals and classes donate money for the children receive a new book to take home. In February, the Living Word and New Christian Fellowship classes provided the Family Fun Night meal.

Drivers Needed


