CCM Requests Pencils, Paper and Prayers

2018 is on track to be one of the busiest years in Christian Cooperative Ministry's (CCM's)

36 years of service to the community. As of the end of June, CCM has provided 2,485 emergency food boxes to local families. These boxes have provided meals for three days for 6,855 people. In addition, 1,842 sack lunches have been distributed to homeless individual so for this year.

Many of these people benefiting from CCM's services are school-aged children. To help the children get a good start this school year, CCM plans to provide them with backpacks filled with school supplies. Your donations of **backpacks, pencils, ruled notebook paper, crayons, Elmer's glue sticks, pocket folders, and spiral notebooks** are appreciated. *Note:* School begins on August 7.

CCM also request prayers for the children, their families and the efforts of CCM to meet their needs.
