
**Fifth Sunday Breakfast on the Hall**

## Preparing for *The Way Forward*

Over the next few months you will likely see in the news media articles regarding the called General Conference of the United Methodist Church in February of 2019 focused on the topic of human sexuality. There are many voices saying all sorts of things about how the church needs to act, and we want to provide a context for understanding the debate, the called General Conference, and *The Way Forward* process that has been studying the issues for the past two years. **On Sunday, October 14 at 3 p.m. we will be gathering with our friends at Matthews Memorial UMC for an orientation to the conversation.** This is not a debate on the various plans, but rather will provide some historical background regarding where we find ourselves today, and a quick review of the various proposals. **On Sunday, October 21 from 3 – 5 p.m.** United Methodists from throughout our district will be meeting at Donelson Heights UMC to allow our General Conference delegation to hear feedback from folks regarding the various plans and their hopes for the church. We encourage all to be in a special season of prayer as we prepare for their special time in the life of our church.

## Quiet Space Update

City Road Family – I want to share with you about what's going on at the Quiet Space. Homelessness in Madison is increasing daily. We have 14-18 guests on Tuesdays alone. Since we began (August, 2016) six of our guest now have jobs and four have left us and are in permanent housing.

Jay and Jim Neely are working on a plan so we can supply our guest with a hygiene bag. (Stay tuned for more information to come). We are in need of some items that our guest can't obtain elsewhere and also some items the Homeless Commission is running low on. They are blankets (gently used is ok), towels and washcloths (gently used is ok), back packs, sweat pants/shirts (winter is coming).

Wednesday will be our first trip out for our new project Shower and Laundry Shuttle going to Community Care Fellowship and we have seven signed up which is great for the first time.

Come and visit and see what we're about down stairs in the Quiet Place.
