## MHNC Welcome Bags

*One of the ways that we welcome our guests in the Housing Navigation Center is to provide a "welcome bag" with basics to help them transition from life on the streets. We are getting low on our supply of bags so if you are able to provide one or two, it would be greatly appreciated.*

*Here is what is needed for each bag:*

- We suggest a reusable grocery tote (Aldi's 99 cent totes are perfect!)
- A used coffee mug from home that you don't want anymore
- 1 square box of tissues
- 1 small box each of plastic forks and spoons (48 pieces)
- 1 large package of gum
- 1 small jar of instant coffee
- 1 small box of plain tea bags
- 1 package of trail mix (16-24 oz)
- 1 small box of ziplock sandwich bags
- 1 roll of paper towels
- 1 toothbrush
- 1 toothpaste
- 1 pair of white tube socks (only 1 pair per bag)
- 1 container of Lysol wipes
- 1 shampoo
- 1 bodywash
- 1 inexpensive hairbrush

It would also be appreciated if you could add a welcome card or a note welcoming our guests to City Road Chapel and that you will be keeping our guests in our prayers.
